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The Process

Put everything on the table (\$, location, expectations).

Communication among student, parent and counselor is essential!

Organization is key!

Narrowing The List

- □ Small, large, or in between?
- City or suburban?
- Public or Private?
- □ Close to home? Far away?
- Does it have what they want?

Range of Schools

Students should apply to a range of schools based on admissions criteria. 3-4 "Reach" schools 3-4 "Target" schools 4-5 "Safety" schools (approx. 10 total)

College Visits

- Tour the campus and attend an Open House.
- Talk to current students.
- Attend a college class. (if possible)
- Observe the student body ("Would I fit in here?").
- If they can't decide do an overnight visit.(if possible)
- □ Utilize virtual tour resource on the college website.



Go For It! Interviews are encouraged. Go prepared! Have questions ready Bring your transcript Make a good impression! Body language Dress appropriately Show a genuine interest in the school! Know something about the school Test Optional Schools! They may want students to set up interviews.

When to Apply?

- Early Decision binding
- Early Action non-binding
 - Restrictive Early Action- Students who apply REA to one school can't apply EA or ED to other private institutions, but they can apply to public universities.
- □ Regular Decision
- Rolling Admission first come/first served
- Open Admission



Student Responsibilities

Complete and Submit the college applications.

Move Colleges from "Following" to "Applying" to "Applied" in SCOIR

Secure Teacher & Counselor Recommendations.

Release Transcript by completing "Transcript Release".

Send SAT/ACT Scores directly from collegeboard.org (SAT) or actstudent.org (ACT).

School Responsibilities

- □ Submit student's transcript & SHS profile.
- Write and submit counselor recommendation letter.
- Complete Secondary School Report Forms.
- Submit Teacher Recommendations and Teacher Evaluation Forms.

The Common Application

- The Common Application is used by nearly 900 colleges and universities.
- It enables students to complete one application online and submit it to multiple colleges.

- What makes them unique
- Be creative open with an attention
- Write about something they know well
- Have it proofread
- How well they write & communicate
- □ See Common App prompts

The Resume

Use template as a guide

Showcase special talents & qualities

Include:

- Awards and Honors
- Community Service
- Extra Curricular Activities
- Work Experience
- Special Interests

Teacher Recommendations

- Choose 1-2 teachers who know them well
- After asking them in person/email, students should give teachers:
 - \circ Teacher recommendation questionnaire & resume
 - Application deadlines
- Request recommendations through SCOIR
- Submitted to colleges directly through SCOIR

Counselor Recommendation

- Counselor Recommendation Questionnaire & resume
- Student Brag Sheet for caregivers
- Each student receives a recommendation.
- Whole person, through the years, extenuating circumstances, etc.
- Secondary school report forms.
- Submitted dire

Transcript Guidelines

- 1. Complete "Transcript Consent Form" and submit to counselor.
- 2. Student must move colleges from "Following" to "Applying" then to "Applied" in Scoir.

Common App ID # must be entered correctly to sync with the student's Scoir account!!!!

Requesting Transcripts

- Transcript Release Consent form 3 weeks to process!!!!!
- Class rank is OPTIONAL.
- Mid-year grades & final grades are automatically sent.
- First quarter grades Note on transcript form if a student does not want them sent.
- Discipline disclosure

A Note about October Deadlines

Some schools may have an early application deadline in October.

If your student is applying to any school with an October deadline, please notify your school counselor at once!

SATs & ACT

- Students send SAT scores directly from CollegeBoard @ collegeboard.org.
- Students send ACT scores directly from ACT @ actstudent.org
- Students may utilize score choice
- Allow 3-4 weeks watch deadlines!
- □ http://fairtest.org/university/optional
- Don't forget to send to the NCAA clearinghouse (if Div 1 or 2!)

Just a few more things...

Students are encouraged to follow up with colleges to ensure they have received the application.

Be open to schools you haven't heard of.Drop in grades or course load? Watch out!

No guarantees - have a back-up plan.

■ Students must enter the decisions into SCOIR (and tell their counselor! 😌)

Your student could be at any one of these steps...

Meeting with their counselor Narrowing down or finalizing their list Researching schools/interviewing Requesting teacher recommendations Writing their essay Completing their resume Taking the SAT or ACT Filling out applications Returning completed counselor questionnaire Requesting transcripts Submitting applications
