

## SCITUATE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

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To Whom It May Concern:

I am reaching out to you to let you know that the Scituate Public School District is mandated to evaluate students suspected of having a disability who reside in Scituate, including students who attend private schools. Massachusetts education regulations require the following conditions in order to be eligible for special education:

- 1) The child must have a documented disability
- 2) The child must not be making effective progress in the general education curriculum.
- 3) The child needs specialized instruction and/or related services to make progress.
- 4) The child must be between the ages of 3 and 22 and has not yet received a High School diploma.
